Successes for Cheshire clubs and athletes.

At the ECCA National Cross Country Relays held in Mansfield on 8 November, the Warrington AC Under 13 Boys team came away with the gold medals, equalling the course record. The team of the "3 Matts" -Ainsworth, O'Neil and Jackson - had a clear win by over 30 seconds with Matt Jackson running the fastest leg and Matt O'Neil the third fastest. They had in the past few weeks had impressive wins in the NW Counties Relays in Liverpool and NoEAA Road Relays in Sunderland (winning here by almost 3 minutes). Vale Royal also competed in the cross country relays with their U17 and U15 ladies teams both achieving 12th in their events.

Congratulations to Laura Bestow (West Cheshire) on gaining selection for the North of England Under 20 Ladies team which took part in a junior international cross country event in Ghent, Belgium early in November. Laura was 5th English Junior to finish (which included a team from South of England).

North West Counties Road Relays 2004.

The Cheshire Fell Race championships were held within the Clwydian Hills event on 2 November. The Cheshire Championship winners were Malcolm Fowler and Sally Gilliver both competing for Pennine Fell Runners. It is essential to book as early as possible as courses will be cancelled if there are insufficient bookings. *That is, do not leave it to the last moment as though you were entering an athletics event!!*

When is a club vest not a vest? Update

In last month's Newsletter I raised what seemed to be a problem with crop-tops. The North of England AA, who get a copy of our Newsletter, have taken up this question with the Secretary of the UK Athletics Rules Group for clarification.

It is the "intention" of the Rule that there is NO difference between a conventional vest, crop-top or leotard **PROVIDED** that the registered colour and other registered markings (bands, diagonals, squares, lettering) are the same for all styles. So for team races all athletes from the same club do not have to wear the same style of "vest" but what they wear must conform as described above.

Please note that the Clothing Rule (Rule 17) does require vests and shorts (or equivalent clothing) to be clean and not be objectionable, even if wet.

The statement I made last time about not wearing croptops for cross country events is a recommendation and advice. It is not mandatory (yet?), but is common sense particularly in cold weather.

North of England Matters - 4.

The UK Athletics Modernisation proposals have now reached the critical stage.

In view of very strong objections within England, the AAA of England along with the North, Midlands and South have put together proposals which have been submitted to UK Athletics and Sport England. These go along with the proposals of having 9 Regional Centres (preferred wording to "hubs") based on the RDC areas as now, BUT retaining the 3 Area territories to carry out a number of functions in conjunction with the Regional Centres. These proposals are due to be discussed by UK Sport, Sport England, AAA of E, UK Athletics and the North, Midlands and South at a meeting at the end of November.

Meanwhile, there is the UK Athletics Congress at Loughborough in a few days which is said will discuss delivery of the proposed structure (which one?) at the local level!! The Congress will be attended by 3 members of the Cheshire committee and hopefully other individuals from Cheshire Clubs who have signed up.

Some good news from NoEAA. At their General Committee meeting on Nov 1st (attended by George Bunner and Brian Warren on behalf of Cheshire County AA) the increase proposed in membership fees was reconsidered at the request of the NoEAA AGM (democracy!). It was decided to revert to the original

proposal namely an increase of £1 per athlete to £2 with effect from 1st May 2004.
