The fourth North West Combined Events, held in brilliant sunshine at Stanley Park, produced a number of top class performances. Although our numbers were down on the record entry of 1996, due to a clash of fixtures with the boys McDonalds league, a total of 193 athletes contested the various events on offer.

Once again, the promotion incorporated the North of England U15 & U17 championships, Merseyside, Cheshire, Lancashire and Gr. Manchester championships. Eleven new C/B/P were recorded along with 24 individual event bests and 281 personal bests.

Arguably, the top performance of the weekend belonged to Roger Hunter in the senior decathlon. Surprisingly only 11 of the original 20 entrants were in attendance. Nevertheless, Hunter produced a personal best score by over 100 points. During the course of the competition he set three new individual event records (400m/ 50.49s, discus/40.10m, PV/4.10m) with both the 400m and PV also being personal best performances.

Hunter's final total of 7159 pts (C/B/P) places him at No. 4 on the current UK rankings and ensures a place in the forthcoming home internationals match.

In the junior competition David Powell retained both the Open junior and Lancashire senior titles with Ashley Pritchard setting a new C/B/P when winning the senior Cheshire title.

In the U17 men octathlon 49 personal bests were set by the competing athletes. Andrew East was never headed in the competition recording four personal bests (hurd, LJ, 400m, shot) on his way to an overall points p/b for a comfortable win in both the Open and NoEAA championships

The battle for 2nd, 3rd and 4th places between Matt Peleszok, Mark Carnaghan and Chris Hopkins was a much closer affair with these positions constantly changing hands. Carnaghan held a narrow lead at the end of day 1 by virtue of his personal bests in the hurdles, long jump and javelin. Peleszok recorded personal bests in the long jump and set a new individual event best of 50.78s in the 400m. Hopkins also had three p/b's on day 1 (hurd, long jump, 400m).

Although Peleszok recorded further p/b's in the discus and shot he dropped back to 4th place with Carnaghan increasing his lead over Hopkins (p/b's HJ and shot). Moving to the final event, 1500m, Carnaghan held a 46 point advantage over Hopkins who was 34 points ahead of Peleszok. All three competitors raced to personal bests in the last gruelling event but Peleszok, p/b by over 9s, leapt into the Open silver medal position ahead of Carnaghan. Hopkins gained some satisfaction when claiming the NoEAA bronze medal.

Simon Heyes recorded seven personal bests, only missing out on the long jump, on his way to the Lancashire title. ~~Tom Manning was another athlete in good form registering 5 personal bests on his way to the Cheshire title~~

The U15 boys pentathlon also produced a comfortable winner. Christopher Dack recorded three personal bests (hurd, LJ, 800m) in addition he added two individual event bests in the hurdles (11.8s) and long jump (5.80m) on his way to both the Open and NoEAA titles. His final score of 2804 pts. places him in the top five UK rankings and on course for a good performance at the ESAA championships in September. Aaron Wilson was another who recorded three personal bests (hurd, LJ, HJ) to claim both the Open and NoE silver medals as well as the Lancashire U15 title.

Twelve budding athletes contested the novel U11 quadrathlon (75m, SLJ, C.ball, 600m). Brendon Kennedy began proceedings by recording an individual event best performance in the 75m (11.1s). This was quickly followed by another event best of 1.97m in the standing long jump. These two performances gave Brendon a comfortable lead over his nearest rivals. Going into the final event Christopher Lonsdale had taken a 10 point lead by virtue of his superior cricket ball throw with George Yardley a further 10 points adrift in 3rd place. At the end of the final event both Brendon and Christopher had recorded new championship best performance totals of 1940 points but Brendon was adjudged the winner on count back. Stephen Hatch raced to a new event best of 1.54,91s in the 600m.

Both the senior and junior women competitions were amalgamated with the top performances of the competition being posted by two juniors. Birchfield athlete Frances Wilkins recorded three personal bests, 100H, javelin and 800m on her way to the North West Open junior title. Her final score of 4652 pts was a personal best by nearly 400 points.

The competition was always close between Wilkins and second placed athlete Kate Rogers. Rogers led from the first event until the javelin recording personal bests in the three opening events (100H, HJ, shot). Following a below par long jump and javelin she went into the final discipline trailing Wilkins by 158 points. Although recording yet another p/b, 2.26.78s, she finished the closely fought competition 54 points adrift of the winner.

Abigail Ashby took the Open title in the senior event with the 1996 champion, Wendy Laing winning the Open silver and the Merseyside gold. Maria Grantham, 4th junior, posted four event personal bests on her way to the Gtr. Manchester senior title setting a new C/B/P as well as an overall personal points total

The U17 womens' heptathlon was one of the closest competitions of the day. The top five athletes all contested the recent North West Regional schools' round but on this occasion the finishing order was different.

Maria Pringle got her competition off to a top class start when recording personal bests in the opening three events after which she held a lead of nearly 200 points over the North West schools' regional winner April Kalu. Danielle Parkinson, after personal bests in the hurdles and high jump was well in contention with the 1996 U15 Open, NoEAA and Gtr. Manchester Champion Tina Thirlwell occupying 4th spot. Following the final event on day one Pringle's lead had been further reduced with Parkinson moving into 2nd spot just 4 points ahead of Karen Lowe. Kalu and Thirlwell kept well in touch with only 9 points separating positions 2 to 4.

Following the opening event on day two Pringle's lead was down to just 37 points over Thirlwell, who was now making a significant move. Parkinson was a further 8 points adrift in 3rd place. The penultimate event, javelin, saw Thirlwell go to the head of the field with Kalu moving into 2nd ahead of Parkinson with Pringle dropping out of the top three for the first time. With only 90 points separating Thirlwell from 5th place Lowe going into the final event any one of the top five athletes could claim any of the titles on offer.

Lowe raced to a personal best, pulling up into 2nd place, with Parkinson running the 800m of her life when knocking over 10s off her previous best. This moved the Rochdale athlete into the bronze medal position but Thirlwell did sufficient to ensure all three titles. Her final score of 4358 points was a big personal best. This U17 title was a hat-trick of wins for the Sale competitor adding to her U15 title in 1995 and her U13 title in 1994. Four of the top five athletes recorded overall score personal bests, the exception being the recent North West Schools' champion Kalu.

The largest field of the weekend contested the U15 Open pentathlon. A total of 54 personal bests were set by the competing athletes with 1996 U13 Open Champion Claire Pleavin recording three P/B's (hurd, shot, HJ), she included a new individual event best of 14.74s in the hurdles, on her way to the Open NoEAA and Cheshire titles. The Warrington youngsters finished with a personal best score of 2157 pts - 150 points ahead of her nearest rival.

The battle for 2nd and 3rd places was a much closer affair between Lorraine Corbett and Melissa Tremarco. Corbett held a 136 point advantage over Tremarco going into the 800m. Although Tremarco raced to a time of 2.33.23s, 9s faster than Corbett, it was not sufficient to prevent the Leigh Harrier from claiming the overall and NoEAA silver medals.

Jennifer Glaysher came close to setting a new U15 high jump (1.66m) when clearing 1.65m on her way to the Lancashire title.
